Braeburn Valley Civic Association Meeting

- I. 6:30 Meeting called to order by Bert Ruiz.
- II. Bert Ruiz introduced the board.
- III. Review and Approval of February 16, 2022, Minutes. Approved by Lance Rosborough and George Mercado seconded it.
- IV. Treasurer's Report by Darren Spriggs. Our waste fees have gone up approx. \$70 per month beginning March 1, 2022, but it has not affected our yearly dues and will remain at \$300. Current annual budget is \$38,884. Actual (realized) is \$29,611. Projected 2022 surplus is \$9700.
- V. 6:45 pm Traffic Speed and Volume Control Project
 - Project Update. A Traffic Study Committees was assembled with representatives from Bonham Acres (4) and Braeburn Valley (3). That committee will serve as liaison between the City of Houston and both neighborhoods.. A total of 16 devises were placed throughout Braeburn Valley and Bonham Acres that will track volume and speed of traffic.
 - *Timeline – tracking is done for 7 days (thru approx. May 23). Data will be organized and looked at for approximately 3 weeks following.
 - Next Steps – The committee will meet with the city to review data the traffic study in May, identify recommendations, and schedule the next city neighborhood meeting. At that meeting residents will vote on a temporary structure improve the traffic situation, then the temporary traffic barrier will be put up, then once again the traffic will be monitored, data collected/studied and given to the neighborhoods to start the process of identifying permanent structure.

 - * Trash taken away from the detention pond.
 - * Several residents agree that the number of gunshots seems to have decreased over the recent weeks.
